Agneta Stark is a professor of gender and economic change at the Gender Studies Department of Social and Welfare Studies at the University of Linköping, Sweden. She received her doctorate in business administration from Stockholm University and was a guest professor at the International Women's University in Hanover, Germany, in 2000. From 1995 until 1998, she was a consultant to the Swedish government for gender equality, and in 1998 she advised the Namibian government in a project about gender mainstreaming in the Namibian national budget.
