Alison Woodward is a co-founder of the Center for Women's Studies at the Free University of Brussels, Belgium. She received her Ph.D. at the University of California, USA. Woodward was a lecturer and researcher at different universities, including the University of Uppsala, Sweden, Wayne State University, USA and the Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm, Sweden. In addition, she was a member of the executive board of the European Sociological Association from 1997 to 2001 and works as a policy consultant for the European Commission, the Council of Europe, the United Nations and the Flemish government.
