Her research focuses on comparative perspectives of gender policies in post-industrial states. She is co-founder and director of the international Research Network on Gender, Politics and the State, and she carried out the study *Appareils Gouvernementaux Chargés de la Politique en Direction des Femmes* for the Ministry of Work and Solidarity in France. In 1997, Mazur drafted a report for the Equal Opportunities Bureau of the European Union.
