Edith Kuiper is a professor at the Faculty of Economics and Econometrics at the University of Amsterdam, the Netherlands. From 2001 to 2002 she was a visiting professor at the Robert Schuman Institute at the European University Institute in Florence, Italy. Since 1999 she has been vice president of the International Association for *Feminist Economics* and since 1997 has been associate editor of *Feminist Economics*. In the past, she developed the research project “Gender & Adam Smith” (2004), which was financed by the Netherlands Organization for Scientific Research.
