Gertrude Robinson is an emeritus professor of media studies at McGill University in Montreal, Canada and was the president of the Canadian Communication Association from 1980 until 1982; she was also the director of the International Association for Media and Communication Research. In addition to her research work, she is renowned for her commitment to national and international organisations of communication and media studies, including her work at the new agencies in world reporting UNESCO project in 1978. She was also a co-editor of the *Canadian Journal of Communication* from 1987 till 1993 and has won several awards for her research work.
