Myra Marx Ferree is a professor of sociology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, USA. She received her Ph.D. at Harvard University in social psychology and social relations in 1976. She was vice-president of the American Sociological Association in 1996 and is co-editor of the *Journal of Sociology, American Journal of Sociology, American Sociological Review, Gender & Society* and *The Sociological Quarterly.* She has published extensively in the area of feminist organisations in the United States and Germany, gender inequality, and the inclusion of gender in sociological theory.
