Patricia Yancey Martin is a professor of sociology at Florida State University, USA. She is an activist, mentor and scholar whose work is at the forefront of gender studies. In particular, she analyses the connections between gender and organisations. Yancey Martin has received various awards, including the Feminist Activism Award (2006) from the Sociologists for Women in Society.
