Biography

Ruth Roach Pierson is a professor emeritus of history at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto, Canada and received her Ph.D. from Yale University, USA. She taught European and women's history and was honoured with numerous prizes and awards, including the Sir John A. Macdonald Prize for Canadian History from the Canadian History Association in 1987 and the Hilda Neatby Prize from the Canadian Committee for Women's History in 1989. In addition, she was the publisher of the renowned journal *Gender & History* between 1989 and 1992 and the publisher of *Women's History Review* in 1991.
